First, let's talk about hardware

- My devices are Apple iThings:
 - iPhone 4s, iPad (2 & 3), iPod touch, AppleTV 2s
- Most good apps are available on other phone platforms like Android
- Caution: if you buy the app from Apple, you'll need to buy it again if you move to Android
- Many phone platforms are compatible with standardized USB chargers and standardized USB external battery packs

Hardware purchasing questions

- If you don't already own a smart phone
 - Decision: iPhone vs Android vs other?
 - What is the advertised battery life?
 - Decision: phone coverage outside of USA?
 - Decision: how much memory (RAM)?
 - Decision: which cellular carrier?
 - Decision: how much monthly service?
 - Voice minutes, data megabytes, text messages
- iPad/tablet additional considerations
 - Decision: WiFi only, or add cellular data service?
 - Does it include GPS and/or compass?
 - No GPS in WiFi only iPad or iPod Touch

Hardware purchasing considerations

- Can you get an extended warranty including:
 - Software support?
 - Hardware replacement if you drop & break it twice?
- Does the phone and the carrier support simultaneous voice & data?
 - AT&T does
 - Verizon recently added that in 4G, on some phones

My purchasing decisions

- iPhone with AT&T; works in almost all countries
- I buy max memory (RAM) not needed for most people
- I have old unlimited data plan from AT&T
- I have smallest monthly voice plan (450 minutes/mo)
 - Rollover voice minutes build up during winter for use during summer
- I have smallest monthly text message plan, not a pay-permessage (200 text messages/mo)
- For iPad, I buy with AT&T cellular hardware
 - iPad allows buying cellular data coverage only for the months when you want it; no annual contract

Caution: making changes to cellular plans

- If you have an unlimited cellular data plan, be careful making changes
 - You may get dropped out of the unlimited cellular data plan if you turn on WiFi hot spot on your phone
- If you have rollover cellular voice minutes, reducing your monthly cellular voice minutes may reset your rollover minutes to zero

Why I like Apple iPhone

- Tons of apps (over 1,100,000) *
- Some apps have a high resolution version for the iPad; optimizes use of the larger display
- Buy app once, use on all: iPhone, iPad, iPod
 - Most apps: pay once, get iPad high resolution version for free
- Lots of 3rd party accessories are available

Hardware: Bluetooth feature

- Bluetooth (in all smart phones) is a way that your smart phone can exchange sound and data with an external device - wirelessly
- Enables hands-free driving with compatible car radio. Can also play music to radio.
- With compatible Bluetooth radios in car and boat, you can move from the car to the boat and the music continues playing where it left off in the car
- If you install Bluetooth in your boat, be sure to install the microphone

Some hardware to consider: Battery running low too soon?

- Keep a 12VDC recharger and long cord on board; consider keeping a 2nd backup pair
- Mophie <u>www.mophie.com</u> juice pack plus
 - more than doubles iPhone battery power, \$99
- Mophie juice pack power station PRO
 - Adds about 50% more power to an iPad 3, \$99
- Recharge the Mophie batteries with USB power
- Dual USB charger can do both iPad and iPhone from same device 'MaximalPower', AC or 12VDC


Some hardware to consider: No signal from AT&T?

- There was no AT&T coverage in the ICW's Dismal Swamp of North Carolina
- Solution: Verizon 4G LTE Mobile Hotspot
 - I have the model 890L
 - Uses its own Verizon cellular data plan & creates local WiFi for up to 4 devices
 - Included battery can support over 4 hours of use
 - Plug into USB charger for longer usage
 - Supports up to 10 devices
 - Cellular data plan: 5GB for \$50/month

Cellular data, coverage maps

- Do a web search (google, etc) for
 - "AT&T cellular data coverage map" or
 - "Verizon cellular data coverage map", etc.
- Scroll through the map to see if there are coverage gaps along the way, at the destinations, etc.

Cellular data coverage example, AT&T vs Verizon near Dismal Swamp

Some hardware to consider: additional items

- Your smart phone is probably not waterproof
 - Unless your have the new smartphone from Sony
 - Get a water resistant fanny pack, as a carrying case
- Your smartphone or iPad/tablet might not be viewable in strong sunlight; need to shade it
- USB extension cables
 - Enable charging phone further away from power source
- Good ear buds for music & conversations
 - Reduce outside noise; improve hearing

iPhone/ iPod/ iPad trick

- Press the circle button from the home screen
- Search window appears with keyboard
- Type in text to find any of these, all at once:
 - Apps by name
 - People in your Contacts list
 - Songs in your Music Library
 - Videos in your Video Library
 - Etc.

Now for the apps

Why smartphone apps

- Smart phone is a very capable computer in your pocket
- Most apps are professional grade
 - Apps = applications, a.k.a. programs
- Usually much less expensive compared to a laptop's version
- Coastal cruisers will typically have Internet connectivity

Two main categories of apps

- 1. Using the Internet
 - Needs Internet connectivity to work
 - Typically no problem for nearby coastal cruisers
- 2. Self-contained
 - All data is in the app; no Internet needed
 - Many self-contained apps need data downloaded first, from the Internet (like map sections)
 - Then they become self-contained for the downloaded data
 - Most valuable for use off-shore or out of country

SmartPhone App pricing

- Many apps are free or \$0.99 (Lucy would approve)
- Some apps are paid by advertisements
- Some apps have a basic free version and then an upgraded version for a higher price
- Some apps sell content in the app (examples: map extensions, magazines)

Much of the app's info is available free via Internet browsing. Apps often add functionality and enable offline usage.

Preparing: Apps to consider, using the Internet

- Weather forecast / weather RADAR
- Wind forecasts
- NOAA bouy data, wave height
- Offline web page reader downloads & stores web page for later offline use
- Local notice to mariners

- TripAdvisor: reviews of destinations, activities, etc <u>http://www.tripadvisor.com</u>

Preparing: apps to consider, self-contained

- Tides and currents
- Sunrise and Sunset [avoid landfall in dark]
- Phase of the moon [if night travel]
- Charts
- Spreadsheet for calculating travel times
- Offline web page reader [for pages previously downloaded]
- User submitted info on destination marinas, shoaling, etc: 'ActiveCaptain'
- PDF reader for owner's manuals
 - Search for key words rather than turn pages

Practical Sailor review of nav apps (as of April 2013)


- Based on iPad:
 - For vector charts (scale as you zoom, clearer):
 - #1: Garmin BlueChart Mobile \$30-\$45 depending on charts; NEW; needs iPad 3; no Android
 - #2: Navionics \$35; iPhone/iPad or Android
 - For raster charts (like paper):
 - #1: iNavX \$50; iPhone/iPad; no Android
 - #2: iSailor \$free + \$15 charts; iPhone/iPad; no Android
- Check if your nav app purchase will include Active Captain, for user contributed info
- Get a water resistant cover or gallon zip lock bag



Preparing: Check destination marinas with 'Active Captain' inside 'Navimatics'

- 'Navimatics' has charts, tides, etc
- 'Active Captain' feature includes comments and reviews from other boaters
- User feedback is updated via Internet; updates are stored


Same info available in Navimatics once downloaded

While underway: apps to consider, using the Internet

- AIS displays [large ships in our path]
- Weather forecasts / weather RADAR
- WebMD [how to treat symptoms; find doctors]
- SBCC Facebook private group
- Play a movie? NetFlix, etc.
 - Careful: One NetFlix movie could use 2GB of cellular data

While underway: add photos to the private SBCC group in Facebook

- Example: East River pictures recently taken by Kristen from their NYC building's roof deck as Andrew & friends transit the East River
- Comment from 'Barbara L': She crews for Andrew; is not an SBCC member (it's OK)




While underway: using Facebook

- Not necessary to enter all your personal info
 - Maybe enter birth month & year, incorrect date
- Don't post about you being away from home
 - to avoid robberies; OK if the home is occupied
- Check your Privacy Settings

While underway: apps to consider, self-contained

- Phone for pictures & videos
- 'iPhoto' and 'iMovie' editing apps for pictures & videos
- 'Navigation Rules': includes configuration of ship's running lights
- 'Signal Flag Info'
- 'Pocket Pharmacy': drug info & interactions
- Play a game?
- Read a book or the NY Times? Kindle app, iBooks
- Watch a downloaded movie? iTunes, etc

After arrival: apps to consider, using the Internet

- 'Urbanspoon' or 'Zagat' for restaurant suggestions
- 'TeamViewer' attach to home computer for remote control, download files
- Skype or FaceTime: video phone call
- Potentially free WiFi phone calls using Vonage,
 Skype, etc. (most useful when out of the country)
- 'Find my iPad' or 'Find my iPhone' could help you find your way back to your boat in a crowded anchorage

After arrival: apps to consider, self contained

- Phone for pictures & videos
- 'iPhoto' and 'iMovie' editing apps for pictures & videos
- 'US Sailing Racing Rules' if joining a race
- 'Navigon' street GPS with talking turn-by-turn directions
- 'Star Walk' or 'GoSkyWatch' for star gazing
- DragQueen, anchor watch

After arrival: star gazing with 'Star Walk'


- Hold up to the sky and it shows you the planets and constellations
- Awesome on iPad (StarWalk HD)



After arrival Drag Queen: Anchor drift alarm

 Set alarm to warn you if your GPS position varies too much





'Find my iPhone' or 'Find my iPad'

- Displays registered device location on a map
- Could be used in a crowded anchorage to find your boat



 Has option to lock the device with a message enabling finder to only phone you
